## **Champions 3 Years in a Row!!!**

Both our 3rd/4th class and 5th/6th class athletics teams travelled to Tullamore to take part in the Offaly Sportshall Athletics Championship last month. We have had tremendous success in this competition claiming both 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> class and 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> class titles in 2012 and 2013. Our run of success continued this year when both our 3rd/4th and 5th/6th class teams won the Offaly championships once again, making it 3 successful back to back wins.

The boys took part in 50m time trials, 4 x 50m relay and 100m time trials. While in the field events they competed in javelin, chest push, triple jump, long jump, speed bounce and vertical jump. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Frank Kilrayne for all his hard work with the boys.



## **Eight All Ireland Medal Winners**

Every year Edenderry BNS is proud to send a representative in both hurling and football to the Offaly Cumann na mBunscol competitions held during the spring. This year Adam McCraith made the long trip to Rath to take part in the hurling where he acquitted himself fantastically well.

## Cumann na mBunscol

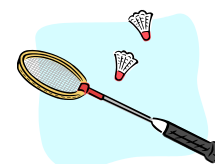

## Food Dudes Programme

Our Food Dudes programme is now in full swing and we have now entered the second phase of the programme. During this phase the children are encouraged to bring in fruit and vegetables as part of their lunch. To date the children have made a terrific effort and have been rewarded with lots of cool prizes. We hope they will continue in their efforts after Easter and win lots of more great prizes!

During the previous phases of the programme (phase one) , the boys sampled a selection of fruit and vegetables over a four day period and were given prizes for their efforts. They were then required to consume a full portion of fruit and vegetable each day for 12 consecutive school days and were rewarded once again with great prizes for their efforts.

Food Dudes was originally developed by the University of Wales, Bangor, to encourage children to eat more fruit and vegetables both in school and at home. It is based on positive role models (the Food Dudes characters), repeated tasting and rewards. In pilot studies in schools in Ireland, the Programme has been shown to be effective and results long lasting across the primary age range, regardless of gender, school size, geographic and socio-economic factors. It is ultimately designed to enable children to enjoy eating healthy diets, and to create a healthy eating culture within schools.
