Welcome to our parents newsletter! We have had a very busy and productive start to the school year with lots of exciting events to look forward to. Literacy Development

As part of our ongoing literacy strategy, all of our classes focused on two particular genres of writing for the months of September and October. In September classes produced some excellent writing samples in the 'Writing to Socialise' genre which are currently on display on the school notice boards. Our pupils are currently studying 'Recount Writing' and are preparing their writing samples for publishing.

We have spent €5000 to date on new reading books and novels for our pupils. Pupils from second through to sixth class are currently using these books as their reading scheme. We added to this in September by spending a further €1500 on fact books. Pupils in all of our classes are currently benefiting from our ongoing investment in new reading books. We ask that you encourage the children to mind these books carefully.

We would also encourage you as parents to bring the children to Edenderry library if you get a chance over the mid term break so that your children might develop a life long love of reading.

National Maths Week

Last week, 12th- 16th October all our pupils participated in a range of activities for National Maths Week. All classes made a special effort to earn as many points as they could on the online maths programme Mathletics. Many of our classes succeeded in reaching the leader boards and were named in the top 50 schools in Europe. Well done to all 77 boys in the school who received a certificate during the week.



On Friday some of our classes took part in a maths trail around the school grounds. Our 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 4^{th} classes also took part in a traffic survey.

Again this year, the 'Guess How Many Sweets Are In The Jar' riddle was the star attraction of Maths Week! There was a 4way tie this year with Lennon, Kenneth, Killian and Said all coming closest.

Mathletics

As part of our varied maths programme, once again this year all pupils will be using the on-line maths programme Mathletics. This program covers all areas of the maths curriculum. It helps children to enjoy maths while at the same time also improves their mathematical reasoning. All children will be using this programme in school with their teacher. This programme can also be used at home and we ask parents to encourage their children to use this program at home if possible.



Our School Band!

Trials for this year's school band will be taking place in early November. We look forward to seeing who will be selected to be part of this year's band. Our school band will begin practicing after the midterm break ahead of their debut performance at our Christmas concert. We look forward to seeing them in action!!

This is to commemorate the centenary of the 1916 Rising and to mark 100 years since the Proclamation of the Irish Republic. The flag will be formally presented to the school in a special ceremony. The children will be taught about how the National Flag should be cared for and the protocol that surrounds this vibrant symbol of our nation. All classes will be completing projects in the new year based on the 1916 Rising. The flag will be raised on the 15th March which is National Proclamation Day and all parents will be invited to attend on that date.
