6th Green Schools Flag Awarded



We are delighted to announce that we have been awarded our 6th Green Schools Flag.

All our hard work has finally paid off as we officially received our 6th green schools flag last month. On 23rd May, Miss Tyrrell, Miss Dolan, Donal Harris and Domantas Aranauskas travelled to Athlone where they were presented with our 6th flag for 'Global Citizenship, Litter and Waste' by An Taisce. This is a fantastic achievement as we are one

of the very few schools around the country who have been awarded their 6th green flag.

The official raising of the flag took place on Thursday 18th June. Past teachers and staff, family members, neighbours of the school and many representatives of Edenderry community joined us to celebrate this fantastic achievement.

Active Flag

We are delighted to announce that we have been awarded with our Active Schools Flag. We are the only school in the Edenderry area to have been awarded this flag.

We have been working hard all year to achieve our Active Flag and on the 27th May, the Department of Education and Skills sent an accreditor to assess our efforts. He was more than impressed with all the initiatives we have undertaken this year and as a result we were awarded with the flag.



All year we have been trying to get our students as active as we can by organising a number of different events throughout the year. Throughout the year our pupils have taken part in a number of different activities some of which include 'Santa Dash' fun run, whole school Halloween flash mob dance to the song 'Ghostbusters', whole school circuits, orienteering, obstacle courses, and a sports marathon. We have entered a number of different competitions and have had tremendous success reaching two All Ireland finals in Athletics and Soccer (in which we were crowned 'All Ireland National Sportshall Athletics champions' and came third in the 'FAI 5-a side All Ireland soccer finals'). We have increased the amount of activity our pupils receive by introducing activity breaks and active brain breaks throughout the school day.

The official flag raising ceremony took place alongside the Green School flag raising on Thursday 18th June. Mr. Patsy O Gorman raised our flag. Patsy has been very involved in providing tag rugby training to our pupils over the past number of years.

Active School Flag is a Department of Education and Skills initiative which is awarded to schools that strive to achieve a physically educated and physically active school community. It highlights the importance of physical education (P.E.), physical activity and sport in schools and communities in which they are based.

Active Week

One of this year's most eagerly awaited events took place from April 27th to May 1st as we took part in our first Active Week. Every day our entire school community enjoyed a variety of exercise based events and the week culminated with a Sports Marathon and Jersey Day on Friday May 1st. During the week our



students took part in swimming, boxing, GAA, fitness classes, fun obstacle relays, orienteering and many more activities designed to help keep them fit and healthy and hopefully to become aware of the benefits of regular exercise in their daily lives. During our sports marathon the boys were able to enjoy PE sessions in Gaelic football, tag rugby, basketball, hockey, athletics, Olympic handball, soccer and many more events.
